
The nucleotide sequence of the *gal T* gene of *Escherichia coli*

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Lemaire and Muller-Hill recently reported the nucleotide sequence of the *gal T* gene of *Escherichia coli* and deduced the amino acid sequence of galactose 1-phosphate uridylyltransferase (EC 2.7.7.12) (1). We determined the nucleotide sequence of this gene by application of the Sanger dideoxy method to EcoRV, Sau3A, RsaI and PvuII restriction fragments. Approximately 80% of the sequence was determined in both strands, and the remaining sequences determined in single strands were confirmed by partial sequences published earlier (2-4). The sequence we obtained was similar to that reported by Lemaire and Muller-Hill, with the exception of the GC-rich region between nucleotides 79 and 114. The sequencing gels for this region were ambiguous owing to band compression caused by extensive secondary structure. We overcame the ambiguities by using dTTP in place of dGTP in the sequencing reactions. This procedure clarified the sequencing gels and allowed the following nucleotide sequence to be determined in both strands. Comparison with the sequence of Lemaire and Muller-Hill (1)

showed that an alignment could be achieved by assuming deletions of G at position 85 and GC at positions 92-93 in the Lemaire and Muller-Hill sequence. Our translated amino acid sequence also differed as follows.

Our sequence analysis indicates that *gal T* consists of 1047 bp and codes for a 348 amino acid protein. This compares with the 1044 bp gene and 347 amino acid protein reported by Lemaire and Muller-Hill (1).

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
